Dear Secretary Clinton,

On the heels of the recent Global Zero Summits in London and Los Angeles, Global Zero will bring together hundreds of outstanding students from around the world for a special Global Zero event at Yale University in New Haven, Connecticut, February 18-19, 2012. We are very pleased to invite you to deliver an address at the Global Zero Student Summit, which will serve as a springboard for a new group of Global Zero student leaders and will mark the launch of Global Zero's 2012 campaign.

Convening for two days, these young Global Zero leaders will participate in intensive policy and campaign training and strategize on building the movement. The program, hosted in partnership with President Ernesto Zedillo and the Yale Center for the Study of Globalization, will include sessions with eminent leaders and experts on key steps to initiating the first in history multilateral nuclear arms negotiations; the \$1 trillion per decade cost of nuclear weapons globally; reduction of U.S. and Russian tactical nuclear weapons in the European theater; nuclear weapons issues in the context of presidential elections in the U.S., France and Russia; and movement building and civic engagement in the 21st century.
