The reform and peace charm offensive is designed simply to get the West to lift sanctions. With Thein Sein playing "good cop," the GOB is perpetuating old regime divide and conquer tactics - e.g. separate peace talks.		
The ethnics want development, but need majority rights for natural resources.		
Want the US/EU/Japan to encourage the GOB to hold trilateral talks with the UNFC-United Nationalities Federal Council ("the most viable ethnic nationality alliance"), the GOB, and ASSK/democratic forces.
