That said, Fatah Central Committee member Tawfiq Tirawi is calling publicly for a "day of rage" against "American blackmail" on February 25, urging demonstrators to protest the veto after Friday prayers. The West Bank village of Beit Ummar (Area C) has re-branded its weekly "popular resistance" protest against settlements and the separation barrier as a protest against the US use of the veto; similar activities are planned for other villages. Clashes last night in Silwan in East Jerusalem, and in the West Bank village of Umm al-Khair near Hebron, appear not to be related to events in New York.

We have issued a warden notice announcing temporary travel restrictions for Routes 1 and 90 and suspending personal travel to the West Bank through Monday; it is already being picked up in the press. I was also asked to cancel a planned trip to Birzeit University, near Ramallah, at the request of university administration, who said they are concerned about the potential for veto-related student demonstrations.
