11. Premier Wen's visit to Brunei - the first by a Chinese Premier - would strengthen mutually beneficial cooperation and deepen bilateral cooperation in energy, health, education, agriculture, economics and culture, Liu said. China and Brunei did not have any disputes; bilateral relations were developing well. During the visit, energy companies from the two countries would sign a cooperative agreement on energy. Brunei was an energy exporter and China was an energy importer, so bilateral energy cooperation was very normal, Liu said.
