We discovered that the varieties of existing breadfruit trees in Haiti are

not as good a variety as those of the Pacific and Jamaica so the introduction of new Ma'afala variety will be very beneficial.

Recipients of the donated trees included three orphanages, the new botanical Gardens, watershed restoration groups, other small organizations and a few interested individuals. The need and interest in breadfruit is so great.

We were very pleased with the trip. We hope to be able to ship in 1000 trees a month by the end of the year. If we can sustain that number for 10 years we will reach our goal of 1 million trees and achieve year round sustainable breadfruit production, and a local market.
