I shared some thoughts with You found the work of unit impressive and convincing You found the brief extraordinarily sobering – you were struck by the scope and nature of the corruption, including the connections to drug trafficking and the links to senior officials It illuminated the comprehensiveness of corruption at the most senior levels Clearly, the cost of doing business in Afghanistan is very high; perpetrators are some of our most trusted and most enlightened counterparts But this may actually reinforce, rather than call into question, the need for a targeted strategy on high-level corruption. We need to ask ourselves if we have the level of insight, interlocutors, cultural understanding, and political leverage to implement a more expansive strategy - and in what timeframe. It is because of these questions that you and Secretary Gates proposed the corruption strategy outlined in your memo from last fall.

That said, I told him, you remain open to input, especially from ADM Mullen.
