Just spoke with Ambassador Yasser Othman, the Egyptian rep in Ramallah. He said that yesterday evening, the Egyptians "got a message from Israeli NSA Amidror, who said that if Hamas is ready to establish a new calm,

Israel is ready to discuss the matter." He noted that Egypt (didn't specify, but presumably EGIS) had spoken with someone in Hamas' Gaza political leadership this morning, who stated that Hamas "does not want to blow up the whole situation ... there need to be red lines beyond which no one progresses, so we are able to ultimately contain the situation and return back to the position from which we started." Othman reiterated that the Egyptians are having great difficulty in reaching contacts from Hamas' military wing, "as they've all gone underground, and are not picking up their phones." He also noted that "there is a sentiment of profound fury within Hamas over al-Ja'bari's killing, it will be very hard to convince them to return to calm this time."

Othman said that Cairo is nonetheless actively trying to calm the situation, urging Hamas leadership to get things under control, as "it is not in Egypt's interest for the situation to deteriorate, as the more it does, the harder it will be for our leadership to contain the mood in Egypt." He underscored that "Egypt is doing its part to try to restrain Hamas, and the U.S. needs to do its part to restrain Israel."

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Othman said the Egyptians decided yesterday evening to open Rafah 24 hours a day for passenger traffic.

I called the Egyptian Ambassador in Tel Aviv to check on rumors that he has been told by his government to go home. He denied that he had received any communication about his status from Cairo. It's just rumors, he told me.

He said that yesterday he had conveyed a message from directly from Ismail Haniyeh to the GOI, saying that Hamas wants to end the current round and was ready to stop firing if Israel stopped. The message also said Hamas was ready to exert control over the other organizations firing rockets.

Now, he said, it appears Israel has chosen to start something new. He said he is seeking information on how much more can be expected. I said I did not think the GOI had made any final decisions yet about how this would proceed.

Comment: The "offer" from Haniyeh is what Amidror said specifically Israel could no longer accept - every other month 150 or so rockets, followed by an Egyptian-conveyed request for a ceasefire.
