Cable to follow, but given interest a low-side initial readout:

I saw Egyptian Amb Auf today. His assessment very upbeat: Positive press coverage reflects substance of meetings. SAG chose to engage with Morsi as President of Egypt, not MB figure. Most meetings were just Amb, Morsi, FM and EGIS chief. They talked prisoners; SAG will release some in Ramadan. They talked investment and trade; Saudi Trade minister will go after Ramadan to Egypt, both sides highlighted importance of resolving trade disputes and clearing the way for more investment opportunities. Morsi emphasized non-interference in internal affairs, standing with Saudi and the Gulf in the face of Iran, deep respect for the Kingdom as reflected in choosing to come to Saudi on first overseas trip. Meeting with CP Salman focused mostly on econ issues, again very positive. Egypt and Saudi as twin pillars of the Arab world, when they agree all will follow. Importance of relationship affirmed all around, groundwork laid for strong future ties that will be demonstrated in a slew of post-Eid bilateral visits. Asked about financial assistance, Auf simply said the Saudis have delivered fully on their promises to date.

Morsi also met with Egyptian citizens here, they are demanding a parliamentarian be specially elected to represent them, also want customs and educational concessions. Morsi (who is popular with Egyptian expats here) enjoyed the meeting, which went well – real constituency politics in action, something he seemed to enjoy.

Our Pol section went over to MFA today to see Arab Affairs Director (I'll see Deputy FM Prince Abdulaziz bin Abdullah tomorrow in Jeddah – he was in the meetings with Morsi (and with Abu Mazen)). MFA official said this was more of a get to know you meeting than anything else. Egyptians asked for more money/financial support – Saudi response on this, as in much else was "we'll wait and see."
