<sup>•</sup> Loose Nukes: Secure all loose nuclear materials around the world in four years;

<sup>•</sup> Reductions in Stockpile: Negotiate dramatic reductions in the stockpiles of U.S./Russian weapons and material;

<sup>•</sup> Fissile Ban: Seek a global ban on the production of fissile material for weapons;

NPT: Strengthen NPT so that nations that don't comply automatically face strong sanctions; and,

<sup>•</sup> Fuel Bank: Create an international fuel bank to back up commercial supplies to remove excuses for nations like Iran that are building enrichment plants.
