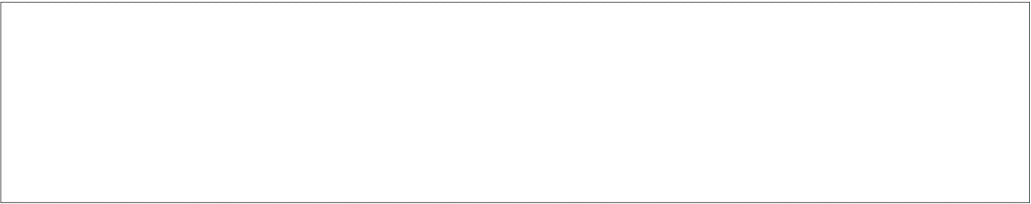

Again, you have more pressing matters today, but I wanted you to see this.

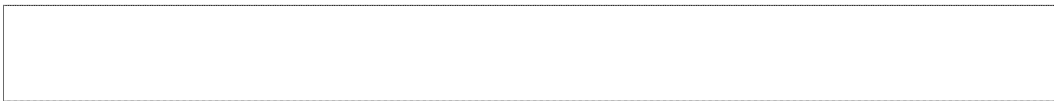
