Washington, DC— The U.S. Global Leadership Coalition today released the following statement from Executive Director Liz Schrayer on Secretary Clinton's *Foreign Affairs* article previewing the Quadrennial Diplomacy and Development Review:

"Secretary Clinton's new strategy is a big win for American security using both our civilian and military tools to keep our nation safe. This powerful statement positions us well to deal with today's threats and be prepared for the future.
