On PM, I am a big fan of [redacted]. Elevating the CTR job via [redacted] makes very good sense.

On ISN, I agree with Bob that [redacted] on the 2007 NIE. But that will not stop Bolton or others from making a big deal of this. Bob's package deal, with [redacted], strikes me as the best course. [redacted] would be good as Non-Pro envoy, and Bob is right that it would be well-received by those in the T community who suffered through the Bolton era.

Senator Clinton, Since Tuesday, I've gotten a bunch of emails and phone calls from T family exiles who watched your testimony and say they want to "reenlist." Others from within the T family tell me they were very encouraged by the emphasis you gave their issues and by the interest you showed in rebuilding State's capabilities in the T area. Thank you. [REDACTED] He knows the nuts and bolts like no one else, yet also sees the big picture. He often took issue with the direction John Bolton was taking our policy, and so Bolton essentially reorganized him out of a job. He's an excellent manager and motivator, and places importance on training junior staff. [REDACTED] in coordinating the 2007 National Intelligence Estimate on Iran (which has been criticized for its misleading unclassified "key judgment" that Iran had halted its nuclear weapons program in 2003).
