Decision Memorandum

<u>Summary</u>: The Agency Program Management Council (APMC) met on December 6, 2018 and evaluated the Agency's Corrective Action Plan (CAP) in response to recent programmatic performance and NASA's designation on the Government Accountability Office's (GAO) High Risk List. In 2007, NASA established a CAP and GAO acknowledged the progress made in closing those initiatives and in 2018 NASA determined a new CAP was necessary to continue working toward improvements and removal from the High Risk List.

The APMC evaluated the Plan's readiness to be established and put into effect, and all actions therein be pursued by the responsible organizations as described. Progress against the Plan will be reported in CY2019, and the Plan will be revised and updated accordingly in CY2019 or as otherwise directed by the NASA Associate Administrator. The Chief Financial Officer has the overall responsibility for the integration of the CAP implementation by the applicable NASA Organizations that have the specific implementation of the initiatives as outlined in the CAP.

Due to the budget and schedule planning for KDP-B being less mature and robust than the later phases, the NASA AA will issue an implementation memorandum detailing the JCL methodology for KDP-B after key stakeholders consult on the details. The JCLs for later phases remain as-is.
