Dear Mr. Greenewald:

This is in reference to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA)/Privacy Act (PA) request dated September 17, 2021. Your request was received in our office on the same day and assigned case number DON-NAVY-2021-0010546.

In the course of processing your FOIA request this office contacted the Office of Legislative Affairs (OLA) to conduct a search for applicable records. Accordingly, that office searched their local files for records relating to "a copy of the referenced "OLA WEEKLY" that appears in a February 21, 2019 email from Capt Gregory Hicks, sent to multiple recipients, including Mr. Joseph Gradisher."

The OLA office has identified 1 record totaling 10 pages that is responsive to your request. Upon review of these records, it has been determined that they contain instances of personally identifiable information (PII), such as the names, dates of birth, and social security numbers of individuals. These instances of PII are exempt from disclosure under 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(6), since release of this information would result in a clearly unwarranted invasion of their personal privacy. The remainder of the records are released to you.

Because your request was partially denied, under 32 CFR §701.12(a), You have the right to an appeal. It must be received within 90 calendar days from the date of this letter. Please provide the appellate authority (see below) the following in an envelope marked "FOIA appeal":

- a letter requesting an appeal that explains what you are appealing with any supporting arguments or reasons you think may be worthy of consideration;
- a copy of your initial request;
- a copy of the letter of denial.

There are two ways to file an appeal: through FOIAonline or by mail.

1. Through FOIAonline. This will work only if you set up an account on FOIAonline before you make the request that you would like to appeal. To set up an account, go to FOIAonline (this is a website that will appear as the top hit if you search the internet for "FOIAonline"), click "Create Account" (a link located within the blue banner at the top in the upper right corner), enter your data into the field that subsequently appears, and click "Save" (at the bottom left of the screen). With your account thereby created, you will have the power to file an appeal on FOIAonline to any request you file on FOIAonline thereafter. To do so, locate your request (enter a keyword or the request tracking number in the "Search for" field on the "Search" tab), click on it, then the "Create Appeal" tab in the left-hand column. Complete the subsequent field, click "Save," and FOIAonline will submit your appeal.

Earlier in the week, it rejected an attempt to bring up a Russian sanctions resolution (SJ Res 2). The Senate may be in session on Sat, but is unlikely to conduct any signno legislative business.

On 16 Jan, the House passed an appropriations package (HR 268) consisting of a disaster supplemental and a short-term continuing resolution (CR) -- details are below. The House also considered but failed to pass two stand-alone short-term CRs. The first CR (HJ Res 27) failed to achieve the two-thirds vote needed to pass under expedited procedure (suspension of the rules). The second CR (HJ Res 28) initially passed by voice, but the vote was voided at the request of the minority and a recorded vote has been scheduled for next week.

Due to the shutdown, both chambers have cancelled next week's recess and will be in session. Next week the Senate's legislative program is TBD. The House will vote again on a CR (HJ Res 28) lasting through 28 Feb. The House will also consider another FY19 appropriations package that includes six of the seven outstanding FY19 spending bills (all except Homeland Security).

1. Executive Summary:

- a. Senate Floor Action. The Senate will try again today to bring the Middle East security/Syria sanctions bill (S 1) to the floor. Earlier in the week, it rejected an attempt to bring up a Russian sanctions resolution (SJ Res 2). The Senate may be in session on Sat, but is unlikely to conduct any signno legislative business.
- b. House Floor Action. On 16 Jan, the House passed an appropriations package (HR 268) consisting of a disaster supplemental and a short-term continuing resolution (CR) -- details are below. The House also considered but failed to pass two stand-alone short-term CRs. The first CR (HJ Res 27) failed to achieve the two-thirds vote needed to pass under expedited procedure (suspension of the rules). The second CR (HJ Res 28) initially passed by voice, but the vote was voided at the request of the minority and a recorded vote has been scheduled for next week.
- c. Nominations Update. The nominations of Ms. Daigle to be ASD(Readiness and Force Management) and Mr. McCaffery to be ASD(Health Affairs) were sent to the Senate on 16 Jan.
- d. Notifications. None.
- e. Significant Events This Week.
  - i. Cancellation of Presidents' Day Recess. Due to the shutdown, both chambers have cancelled next week's recess and will be in session.
  - ii. Committee Assignments Announced. The committee/subcommittee assignment process is ongoing. Assignments announced this week include:
    - SASC. Subcommittee assignments are now complete. The subcommittee rosters are included in the attachments. Highlights:
      - All subcommittee chairs are the same except at Seapower, where Sen. Perdue (R-GA) has replaced Sen. Wicker (R-MS).
      - There are three new subcommittee ranking members: Sen. Manchin (D-WV) has replaced former Sen. Nelson (D-FL) at Cybersecurity, Sen. Heinrich (D-NM) has replaced former Sen. Donnelly (D-IN) at Strategic Forces, and Sen. Peters (D-MI) has replaced Sen. Heinrich at Emerging Threats.
      - There are three new members on Seapower: Sens. Ernst (R-IA), Tillis (R-NC), and Hawley (R-MO).
    - HASC. Assignments to the full committee were announced this week. Subcommittee leadership and rank-and-file assignments are pending. The total number of seats is now 57 (31/26 ratio) vice 62 (34/28 ratio) in the last Congress. A copy of the full committee roster is included in the attachments. Highlights:
      - Newly Assigned Democrats (16): Freshman Reps. Cisneros (D-CA), Crow (D-CO), Escobar (D-TX), Golden (D-ME), Haaland (D-NM), Hill (D-CA), Horn (D-OK), Houlihan (D-PA), Kim (D-NJ), Luria (D-VA), Sherrill (D-NJ), Slotkin (D-MI), Torres Small (D-NM), and Trahan (D-MA); veteran Reps. Keating (D-MA) and Vela (D-TX).
      - Newly Assigned Republicans (2): Veteran Rep. Bergman (R-MI) and freshman Rep. Waltz (R-FL).

○ Departures (8): Reps. McEachin (D-VA), O'Halleran (D-AZ), and Veasey (D-TX) have left to join the Energy & Commerce Committee. Reps. Murphy (D-FL), Panetta (D-CA), and Suozzi (D-NY) have left to join the Ways & Means Committee. Rep. Hice has left to reduce the number of his committee assignments. Rep. Jones (R-NC) has taken a medical leave of absence. (He remains at home in NC.)

● SAC-D and SAC-M. On 14 Jan, SAC Chairman Shelby (R-AL) and Vice Chairman (Ranking Member) Leahy (D-VT) announced SAC subcommittee assignments. On SAC-D, all members return except Sen. Daines (R-MT) who moved to SAC-M. Sen. Boozman (R-AR) joined the subcommittee. On SAC-M, all members return except Sen. Moran (R-KS). He retains his seat on SAC-D. Complete SAC-D and SAC-M rosters are included in the attachments.

● HAC-D and HAC-M. On 14 Jan, HAC Chairwoman Lowey (D-NY) posted HAC subcommittee assignments for new Democratic members. On HAC-D, all Democrat members returned and the following new members were assigned: Reps. Kilmer (D-WA), Aguilar (D-CA), Bustos (D-IL), Crist (D-FL), and Kirkpatrick (D-AZ). On HAC-M, Schultz has been posted as the Chairman and the following Democrats are assigned: Reps. Bishop (D-GA), Case (D-HI), Cartwright (D-PA) and Bustos (D-IL). Subcommittee rosters will be provided once Republican assignments are made.

● HPSCI. Veteran Reps. Demings (D-FL), Krishnamoorthi (D-IL), S. Maloney (D-NY), and Welch (D-VT) have been newly assigned to the HPSCI. All other Democrats return. Republican assignments are pending.

iii. Rep. King (R-IA) to Receive No Committee Assignments. On 14 Jan, House Minority Leader McCarthy (R-CA) announced that Rep. King will not be seated on any committees in the 116th Congress due to his recent public statements that “call into question whether he will treat all Americans equally, without regard for race and ethnicity.” During the last Congress, Rep. King served on the Judiciary Committee, where he chaired the Constitution & Civil Justice Subcommittee. He also served on the Agriculture and Small Business Committees.

f. Appropriations.

i. Supplemental Appropriations. The House passed a supplemental appropriations bill (HR 268) for hurricane, wildfire, and other disaster recovery. The bill includes funds for Service recovery from Hurricanes Michael and Florence: \$200M in USMC O&M, \$115M in DoN MILCON, \$400M in USAF O&M, and \$700M in USAF MILCON. The supplemental is not expected to advance until a larger agreement to end the partial government shutdown is reached.

g. Significant Events Next Week.

i. Senate and House Floor Action. As reported above, both chambers have cancelled next week's recess and, with the exception of Mon's federal holiday, are expected to be in session. The Senate's legislative program is TBD. The House will vote again on a CR (HJ Res 28) lasting through 28 Feb. The House will also consider another FY19 appropriations package that includes six of the seven outstanding FY19 spending bills (all except Homeland Security).

ii. Rep. Marino (R-PA) to Resign. On 23 Jan, Rep. Marino of the HFAC will resign from the House to take a job in the private sector. In 2017, he withdrew his nomination to be director of the Office of National Drug Control Policy.

h. Significant Near-Term Events.

- i. Next Recesses. The House and Senate are scheduled to recess the week of 18 Feb (which includes the Presidents' Day holiday) and the week of 18 Mar.
- ii. State of the Union (SOTU) Address. The shutdown may affect the SOTU address scheduled for 29 Jan. Speaker Pelosi (D-CA) has asked POTUS to reschedule the address or deliver it in writing.
