The processing of your request for information pertaining to the attack of the Tanker LIMBURG has been completed. All releasable information is provided to you at enclosure (1), along with an explanation of exemptions taken under 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(1) and (b)(7)(C).

Our file contains photographs of a deceased person. In deference to the family of the deceased those photographs have been withheld pursuant to 5 U.S.C. \S 552(b)(7)(C).

As the official responsible for the partial denial of your request, I am advising you of your right to appeal this determination. Your appeal must be postmarked within 60 calendar days from the date of this letter. An appeal should be addressed to the Secretary of the Navy's designee: Office of the Judge Advocate General, (Code 14), 1322 Patterson Avenue, S.E., Suite 3000, Washington Navy Yard, D.C. 20374-5066. The envelope and letter should bear the annotation "FOIA Appeal".

While processing your request we located documents proprietary to the United States Coast Guard, HQ USCG Commandant, G-S11, Washington, D.C. 20593-0001. Because we do not have the authority to release information other than our own, those documents have been referred for processing and direct response to you.

Falling below the automatic fee-waiver threshold, fees in this case have been waived.

EXPLANATION OF EXEMPTIONS

FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT (5 U.S.C. §552):

- (b)(1) protects from disclosure national security information concerning the national defense or foreign policy;
- (b)(2) related solely to internal personnel rules and practices, the release of which would allow circumvention of a statute or rule;
- (b)(3) specifically exempt from disclosure by statute;
- (b)(4) trade secrets and commercial or financial information obtained from a private source which would cause substantial competitive harm to the source;
- (b)(5) pre-decisional opinions and recommendations, inter-agency or intra-agency memoranda or letters that show foreseeable harm if released. Also, attorneyclient privilege and attorney-work product are covered;
- (b)(6) personnel and medical information, the release of which would result in a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy;
- (b)(7) investigatory records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, which (A) could reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement proceedings, (B) would deprive a person of a right to a fair trial or an impartial adjudication, (C) could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, (D) could reasonably be expected to disclose the identity of a confidential source, (E) would disclose investigative techniques, and/or (F) could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of an individual.


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
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

18. (U) Exhibits (16) through (18) are excerpts of Yemeni news reports concerning the explosion involving the MV LIMBURG.

19. (U) Subsequent to its departures from Yemeni waters in November 2002, the MV LIMBURG was towed to international waters off the coast of the U.A.E. where her remaining cargo of crude oil was off-loaded and her cargo holds cleaned. As of this date, the MV LIMBURG remains unrepaired, at anchorage off the coast of Fujayrah, U.A.E. where it is reportedly up for sale by the owners. This investigation is closed.





The Limburg is disabled and still leaking oil

Yemeni and French experts are searching for clues on the oil tanker Limburg as opinions differ over the cause of an explosion which crippled the vessel on Sunday.

Business Malaysian Prime Minister Mahathir Mohamad said that state oil company Petronas - which chartered the tanker - "did not suspect any sabotage", adding that the explosion could have been triggered by a short circuit.

Meanwhile Yemeni BIBIC WEATHER officials said the body CBIBIC NEWS of a Bulgarian crew member - the only person aboard ship unaccounted for since the explosion - had been found ashore.

All the other 24 crew members are safe.

The United States and France have both sent teams to Yemen to investigate, amid fears that this might be part of a series of attacks on shipping by al-Qaeda or other groups.

"A member of the crew told me he saw a small boat approach and I believe him."

Journalists taken by Yemeni officials to look at the Limburg report a metre-wide hole, with tangled metal pointed outward, suggesting an on-board blast.

However, a Reuters correspondent saw an oval-shaped hole about 8 metres (26 ft) wide, with the edges dented inward.

The captain said he thought that the first explosion occurred on the outside of the ship.



The American team from the Naval Criminal Investigative Service is being sent according to US defence officials, at the request of the Yemeni Government.





The team from Bahrain is said to be expert in post-blast and forensic investigation.

Yemen has launched its own investigation into the Limburg blast, and says it will co-operate with French investigators who are on their way to the scene.

French Foreign Minister Dominique de Villepin said the probe "will find out exactly what happened" and stressed that "no possibility is ruled out".

Two groups of French experts are to take part in the inquiry - agents from France's counterintelligence service, the Territorial Surveillance Directorate or DS, and another team, made up of transport ministry investigators.

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Terror attack devastates Officials reluctant to confront fears of economic re


AL-MUKALLA, October 10 - Two days after the explosions on the French-flagged supertanker Limburg near the southeast Yemeni city of Al-Mukalla, sufficient evidence has come to light to determine that a terrorist attack was responsible for the blasts.

Yemen, one of the world's poorest countries, is still reeling from the economic fallout felt following the USS Cole attacia in the Port of Aden in December, 2000. While Al-Qaeda directives have recently encouraged operatives to attack oil shipments in order to cripple Western economies officials here are aware that it is Yemen that will suffer most from another terrorist attack on its shores.

In a situation described as "difficult" by Capt. Said Yafai, Yemen's Minister of Transport and Marine Affairs, major economic repercussions are already being felt by the impoverished South Arabian nation.

The explosions abourd the Limburg, which was to pick up 1.5 million barrels of crude oil from the Port of Al-Dabah, 15 km east of Al-Mukalla, have led to a complete halt of oil pumping activity in Yemen's eastern Hadhramout region. Al-Dabah, which has only a limited storage capacity, is full. Unable to load the Limburg, it is unable to receive any more crude oil. Pumping has stopped completely of more than US \$1 million of crude oil a day that pass through the port.

Yemen's Central Statistics Authority, oil production makes up 95% of the nation's total exports.

Shipping companies have meanwhile ordered vessels away from Yemen's coasts, turning to alternate refueling stations and delaying shipments to and from the country. The companies have requested military escorts into Yemeni ports, and the Yemeni government has guaranteed the security of ships at its ports, providing helicopters and naval vessels.

An American ship is expected to be the first to end the halt to loading at Al-Dabah, scheduled to take on oil on Thrusday, marking a four-day interruption in operations.

"Fresident Saleh and the Government of Yemen have kept their word. We still have work to do, and indeed this visit reinforces our commitment to work together towards a successful end to the terrorist threat in Yemen, as well as in the rest of the world."

We committed ourselves to working together, both in terms of training and supporting the Government of Yemen in pursuing this threat in Yemen, and more broadly as part of the war against terrorism."

He said that the US has more than 60,000 troops deploved in every region of the world working on specific counterterrorism objectives. "Our focus in Yemen is on counterterrorism with our partners in the Yemeni government." he added.

He pointed out that counterterrorism in Yemen is the responsibility of the Government of Yemen, giving his commitment to working with the Yemeni government to

ensure effective action against terror. In regard to the Limburg incident, he said, "We are prepared to respond to any request as we have from the Government of Yemen and the Government of France to assist in the investigation of the incident of the ship. Obviously, everyone is concerned about what happened," the US official said.





ni government has drawn the ire of factions pledging support to terrorist groups for its outspoken support of the American War on Terror and repeated offensives against Al-Qaeda

operatives within the country.

A number of explosions in Sana'a, Yemen's capital, notably at the Civil Aviation Authority and near the Presidential Palace, were attributed to one particular group sympathetic to Al-Qaeda. Leaflets circulated by the group promised more such attacks in the future, targeting not American but Yemeni interests and the national economy if the government failed to withdraw support for American counterterrorism initiatives.

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"President Saleh and the Government of Yemen have kept their word. "The initial results of the inquiry carried out by French, Yemeni and American investigators suggest the explosion of October 6 on board the French oil tanker, the Limburg, was due to an attack," a statement of the French Foreign Ministry echoed.

The investigators said that

metal and plastic pieces along with remains of TNT explosive material was found on the deck suggesting that the ship was rammed by a smaller craft.

The Limburg was brought into Mina al-Dabah port in Al Mukalla by three tug boats.

American officials said the blast was an act of terrorism

most likely carried out by people with links to al-Qaida.

Crew saw small boat

This claim is also supported by the tanker's owner,

who quoted crew members as saying the blast occurred shortly after a small boat was seen speeding toward the tanker as it waited for a tug to take it to Mina al-Dabah near Mukalla, about 500 miles from Sana'a.

What's the environmental impact of the explosion?

Efforts are being made to clean the oil from the explosion of the French supertanker Limburg on Yemeni territorial waters and its coasts.

But the spilling of the 397,000 barrels of crude of oil may be an irrepairable ecological disaster for sea animals along Yemen's coastal lines, which in turn could mean financial ruin for thousands of area fishermen.

Environmental experts who need to tackle the problem have an immense job ahead of them.

Fishermen at al-Mukalla have expressed their resentment of the water pollution as a result of the oil that has spread across the

They haven't been allowed to fish, but will be allowed again after the completion of the investigation processes.

"This was the best season for fishing banks in Hadhramout coast lines," said one fisherman.

The tanker was carrying 397,000 barrels of Iranian crude and was due to load more at Mina al-Dabah, a port 500 miles south-east of the Yemeni capital Sana'a.

The explosion took place in Ashehr District in Hadhramout.

Initial reports questioned if the blast was terrorism, but both American and French investigators say they believe evidence suggests it was terrorism.

Id French television France 3 on Thursday that debris found on the deck of the tanker did not come from the tanker.

"We found on the Limburg deck some parts mainly made of plastic and of a mixed glass-resin material used for constructing yachts and, in Yemen, fishing boats. We found that on the tanker deck along with some metal debris," he said.

This contradicts suggestions of Yemen's Minister of Sea Transport Saeed Yafaei that the parts might have come from the tanker's own rescue boat.

"Investigators have indeed found fiberglass parts, but they might be from the tanker's rescue boat that was damaged in the accident. The parts will be sent to laboratories to be tested and determine whether it belonged to the damaged boat," said who also is the chief of the Yemeni team investigating the Limburg blast.

He made the comment Thursday to Yemen's official news agency Saba.

Earlier, a U.S. defense official said several factors pointed to a terrorist attack: the hole in the ship is at sea level, which is consistent with it being struck by a boat or weapon, and the vessel is relatively new, making it unlikely that a malfunction caused the blast.

U.S. intelligence also picked up indications in recent weeks that terrorist groups remain interested in targeting maritime shipping, the defense official said.

Speculation that the incident was an act of terrorism arose shortly after the explosion, which spilled oil along 72 kilometers of coastline. The Limburg's captain later told The Associated Press a crew member saw a fishing boat approach the tanker shortly before the blast.

Contradictory reports

At first, Yemen, which has been eager to emphasize its commitment to

the U.S.-led war on terrorism, sought to dismiss reports that the blast was deliberate. Those statements were reported in the local Yemeni press during last week. "We were quite confident that when our officials say something, they mean it. So we took the official statements saying that the cause of the attack was an accident for granted," a Yemeni journalist told YT.

But a Yemeni government official, speaking on condition of anonymity, said the investigation so far has yielded contradictory information and the blast may in fact have been an act of terrorism.

The pan-Arab daily Asharq al-Awsat reported Thursday that it received a statement from a militant Muslim group claiming it attacked the ship. The paper said the Aden-Abyan Islamic Army claimed it carried out the explosion to avenge the execution of one of its leaders for the 1998 kidnapping of 16 Western tourists.

The Aden-Abyan Islamic Army was formed by Yemeni and other Arab fighters who, like bin Laden, helped Afghans oust Soviet invaders with U.S. help in the 1980s.

A Yemeni official, Abdul Kader Hilal, questioned the reported Aden-Abyan Islamic Army claim, saying the group does not have the means to carry out such an operation. But he said one of the group's members was among those detained for questioning.

Pollution catastrophe

"If there is anyone who has been hurt most of this, then it is us." said a Yemeni fisherman near the coast of Mina al-Dabah port. "The sea is our only source of income, and now look at what happened to it! How can we make ends meet any more amidst so harsh economic conditions." he said.

The pollution issue has become the major concern of the Yemeni officials in the area. "Yemen is facing an environmental disaster, its beaches having been hit by tonnes of crude oil from the French-flagged supertanker Limburg

which burned in the Gulf of Aden" an official said.

It is estimated that the total area polluted with crude oil spilled from Limburg amounted to 500 square kilometres, some 15cm deep, according to a press release distributed by the crisis cell, formed to follow up the incident.

The press statement also revealed that "Plans are being prepared by the crisis cell in cooperation with the local authorities and citizens to contain this problem."

France more alert

On the other hand, France had revealed plans to step up its security measures for French citizens in the Middle East and is considering providing military escorts for French ships in the Indian Ocean, government spokesmen said on Friday.

The Foreign and Defence Ministries announced the measures after Paris announced on Thursday evening that it seemed likely the explosion on the French-flagged supertanker Limburg off the Yemen coast on Sunday was an attack.


"We are going to increase our level of protection for French residents in the region," Foreign Ministry spokesman Francois Rivasseau told a joint briefing with his Defence Ministry counterpart Jean-Francois

Embassies in the region were to review and update existing security plans, he said.

Bureau said a multinational force in the Indian Ocean consisting of eight warships — including two French vessels — under German command could start to escort merchant ships as it did in 1987 and 1988.

But he stressed no decision had been made on this yet.

"Escorts are being considered but they will be neither permanent nor constant," Bureau said. Any escorts could only operate in international waters, he added.

Arrests made in Al-Mukalla terror attack

AL-MUKALLA - Minister of Interior Rashad Al-Alimi announced Wednesday, October 16 that Yemeni security forces, as part of the investigation into the terrorist attack on the French supertanker Limburg October 6, have raided a facility in Al-Mukalla and discovered supplies of bomb-making materials believed used in the attack.

In a preliminary announcement, stated that several arrests have been made in connection with the raid, although numbers and identities of those arrested have not yet been revealed. The announcement of the arrests comes as Yemen's first official innouncement that the explosions poard the supertanker, which ed one Bulgarian crewman and pilled more than 50,000 barrels of crude oil into the ecologically sensitive Gulf of Aden, were in fact the result of a terrorist attack.

French and American investigators aboard the Limburg announced last week that traces of TNT were found around the hole blasted in the Limburg's hull at water level, and fragments of fiberglass similar to that found in local fishing boats were scattered on the deck of the tanker.

Although some factions have already said they were behind the blast, a credible claim of responsibility for the attack has yet to be made. There was no indication in the Minister of Interior's announcement as to the affiliation of those arrested in Wednesday's op-



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UNDP pledges assistance to oil spill cleanup

AL-MUKALLA - An intensive cleaning campaign started last Tuesday along the coastline and coastal waters of the Governorate of Al-Mukalla, despoiled when a terrorist attack penetrated the dual hull of the Limburg, a French oil tanker, on October 6.

These cleaning activities follow training programs held a few days ago given to more than 40 participants by NGOs concerned with environment issues.



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
