This letter is in response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request received by our office on January 9, 2024, in which you requested:

All emails from October 25, 2017 – January 20, 2021, sent to, from, or copied (cc:/bcc) former Assistant Secretary of Commerce for Oceans and Atmosphere (and Acting Under Secretary of Commerce for Oceans and Atmosphere and Administrator of NOAA) Timothy Gallaudet, containing any of the following keywords:

We have located 51 records (consisting of 245 pages) responsive to your request. A total of 167 pages of these records are being released to you in their entirety.

We are also releasing 78 pages that contain redactions under exemption (b)(6), to protect personal privacy. Your request is complete.

You have the right to file an administrative appeal if you are not satisfied with our response to your FOIA request. All appeals should include a statement of the reasons why you believe the FOIA response was not satisfactory. An appeal based on documents in this release must be received within 90 calendar days of the date of this response letter at the following address:

For your appeal to be complete, it must include the following items:

- a copy of the original request,
- our response to your request,
- a statement explaining why the withheld records should be made available, and why the denial of the records was in error.
- “Freedom of Information Act Appeal” must appear on your appeal letter. It should also be written on your envelope, or e-mail subject line.

FOIA appeals posted to the e-mail box or Office after normal business hours will be deemed received on the next business day. If the 90th calendar day for submitting an appeal falls on a Saturday, Sunday or legal public holiday, an appeal received by 5:00 p.m., Eastern Time, the next business day will be deemed timely. FOIA grants requesters the right to challenge an agency’s final action in federal court. Before doing so, an adjudication of an administrative appeal is ordinarily required.

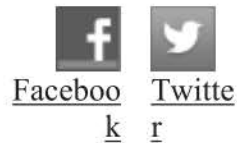

Dear Board members:

Last week was a very long and successful week at the Foundation Board meeting in New Orleans. First let me thank all of you that joined the tour of coastal Louisiana to view many of our current and planned projects. It's impressive in scale, scope and planning. We appreciate the time of the CPRA leadership in joining our Board members.

Elizabeth and I enjoyed having many of you for an evening at Avery Island. We are proud of our family's commitment to conservation and industry. We hope you enjoyed learning about the area's history. As well, it was good for us to meet with Secretary Zinke during our visit and understand his efforts to address infrastructure backlog at our Nation's parks and refuges. Secretary Zinke also joined us on Tuesday night at our Board dinner at the World War II Museum in New Orleans.

We had significant operational and governance topics to review when we began our meetings to: 1. Plan for FY19-20; 2. Update governance bylaws and charters and Signature Delegation Authority Policy; 3. Prepare for the Enterprise Risk Management efforts for FY19-20; 4. Review the completion of FY18 financial activity; 5. Receive an update on the ongoing FY18 financial audit; 6. Discuss the Grantee Overhead review; 7. Receive reports on the Gulf Expenditure Verification Program; 8. Review Government, Corporate, Foundation and Philanthropic Funding Strategies; 9. Complete compensation adjustments related to the senior management team; 10. Discuss the upcoming number of Board re-appointments and vacancies; 11. Discuss efforts to enhance the GEBF and Halliburton investment portfolios.

As Jeff and team continue to work toward FY19-20, it was incredible to see the financial performance and level of activity in FY18. It is fair to say that it was our strongest year ever — as we ran an operational reserve of more than \$5 million, raised record levels of revenues and made conservation investments of more than \$330 million across our entire funding portfolio. Congratulations to everyone for this strong year. Conservation across America was the winner. If you have the opportunity, please congratulate Jeff and the entire team.

As we look to plan for 2019-20, there is significant economic and political uncertainty that could impact our future operations. The team continues to monitor and adapt to unforeseen challenges and remains optimistic on future growth.

We also had a significant 2018 programmatic grant slate we approved that included 235 grants for a total NFWF investment of \$73 million. Looking forward, we can expect the program plan to include approximately \$200 million to be obligated in FY 2019 to support the Conservation Framework strategies through more than 680 projects across the nation. These investments will be allocated directly to our priority landscapes and

species, as well as distributed across the nation to support multiple geographies and species.

The Board also approved \$283 million in new projects under the Gulf Environmental Benefit Fund (GEBF) - the second largest set of awards to date. Since its inception five years ago, NFWF has now obligated over half of the \$2.5 billion we have received in accordance with the plea agreements. In addition, several Board members traveled to Baton Rouge following the meeting to tour the new Center for River Studies that houses a small-scale model of the lower Mississippi River. CPRA leadership provided a briefing on how this model will guide their design and future operation of the large-scale river diversion projects supported by GEBF.

Let me close this report by again thanking everyone that was able to attend. We have always enjoyed strong Board interest and commitment, and we are proud of the high attendance at our meetings. I am looking forward to seeing you in Puerto Rico in March. If you need anything before our meeting, please just let me know.

Elizabeth and I want to wish you all good health and happiness for the holidays.

Dear Board members:

Last week we enjoyed a wonderful Foundation Board meeting in Dorado Beach, Puerto Rico. I truly believe it was one of our most productive meetings – but also in the most amazing location.

First let me thank Friedel and Carolina Stubbe, and Blas Fonalledas and Diana Pérez for the hospitality they extended to the Board and staff of the Foundation during our stay in Puerto Rico. We were warmly received and we greatly appreciate the extra efforts put forth by the staff. It was a great pleasure to welcome new Board Member K. C. Walsh and his wife Karen to the NFWF Board of Directors.

We had significant operational and governance topics to review when we began our meetings to: 1. Discuss Board of Directors appointments for upcoming Board vacancies; 2. Review Enterprise Risk Management and the emphasis on cyber security to be discussed at the August Board Meeting 3. Sub-recipient Indirect cost discussion; 4. Receive an update on the recently completed FY18 financial audit – the 10th consecutive clean audit and 5. Financial review of the FY19 budget.

We also approved a significant Spring 2019 programmatic grant slate that included 60 grants for a total NFWF investment of \$9 million. With match, these investments come to \$30 million for conservation. Looking forward, we can expect the program plan to include an additional \$195 million to be obligated in FY 2019 to support the Conservation Framework strategies through approximately 600 projects across the nation. These investments will strengthen our partnerships and be allocated directly to our priority landscapes and species across the nation.”

The Board also approved 4 grants totaling \$8 million in new projects in Florida, Mississippi and Texas under the Gulf Environmental Benefit Fund (GEBF). Since its inception five years ago, NFWF has now obligated over half of the \$2.5 billion we have received in accordance with the plea agreements.

Next Tuesday, March 26th, will mark the 35th Anniversary of the legal creation of NFWF. This is a remarkable milestone and I am incredibly proud of the conservation impact produced by this Foundation over the last 35 years. All of us should be proud – and we will celebrate the milestone at our August meeting.

Let me thank everyone who was able to attend the Board Meeting. We have always enjoyed strong Board interest and commitment, and we are proud of the consistent high attendance at our meetings. I am looking forward to seeing you in Jackson Hole in August.

Finally, we want to also acknowledge our conservation partners in Puerto Rico – U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, U.S. Forest Service, NOAA, Conservation Trust for Puerto Rico and the

Department of Natural and Environmental Resources of Puerto Rico They showed us the impact of our investments in Puerto Rico and the need to continue the work around the Islands.

And, I'm happy to report that "Gus Lives,(our hatched sea turtle)" and is swimming somewhere in the Caribbean.
