This is in response to your request dated 14 December 2018 and received in the National Reconnaissance Office (NRO) on 17 December 2018. Pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), you requested, "records, electronic or otherwise, of the following: All issues of RECON Magazine published in the calendar year 2008."

A thorough search of our files and databases located responsive records that is being released to you in part.

Material withheld from release is denied pursuant to FOIA exemptions:

- (b)(1) as properly classified information under Executive Order 13526, Sections 1.4(c) and (g); and
- (b)(3), which is the basis for withholding information exempt from disclosure by statute. The relevant withholding statute is 10 U.S.C. § 424, 18 U.S.C 798, 50 U.S.C. 3024 (i) and P.L. 86-36.

You have the right to appeal this determination to the NRO Appellate Authority, 14675 Lee Road, Chantilly, VA 20151-1715, within 90 days of the above date. You may also submit an appeal electronically through the National FOIA Portal at www.foia.gov or via email to FOIA@nro.mil. Please include an explanation of the reason(s) for your appeal as part of your submission. The FOIA also provides that you may seek dispute resolution for any adverse determination through the NRO FOIA Public Liaison and/or through the Office of Government Information Services (OGIS). 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
(U//FOUO) Records & Information Management Forum

Facility management is critical to environmental and safety personnel, most of who are embedded in the facility support function. The senior leaders readily answered questions about the structure and methods of the transformed MS&O organization.
