

The Application notes that the U.S. embassy advised the PCA by email that Ms. Kalicki should seek a specific license to authorize, to the extent otherwise prohibited, services incident to Ms. Kalicki's engagement as arbitrator in this arbitration and the acceptance of fees for that service. 


